Continence and the maintenance of identity:

Ways in which personality, beliefs, socio-demographic characteristics and assistive devices moderate the impact of urinary incontinence on identity and quality of life in later life.

This is an exciting opportunity to be involved in a high quality, interdisciplinary research project which is being funded by the cross-council New Dynamics of Ageing programme.

A high calibre applicant with a social or health science background is required to join the project team to undertake a full-time PhD on the topic of incontinence and identity. The student will be supervised by Professor Mary Gilhooly, Executive Director, Brunel Institute for Ageing Studies.

The successful applicant will be provided with a bursary of **£15,290** per annum (including London weighting) plus full home/EU tuition fees for up to three years.
